

LOUISIANA TRAPSHOOTING HALL OF FAME

ROBERT MILLER



Robert (Bob) Miller was born in New Orleans in 1941. He graduated from Jesuit High School in 1959 and from the University of Southern Mississippi with a PhD in School Psychology in 1967. He began his professional career at UNO as an educational psychologist. His career continued at Loyola University as an adjunct professor and clinical counselor. After 33 years, Bob retired from academics.

In 1987, Bob married his wife of 29 years and fellow clay target shooter, Dr. Betsy Young M.D. After shooting competitive skeet for 18 years, he began shooting trap and helped initiate ATA shooting at South LA Gun Club.

Bob has won 29 ATA championship, class, and category trophies at the LA State Shoot from 1994 through 2015 in-

cluding three championship handicap trophies, and in 1995 he won HAA champ. In 2002, his winning handicap score of 99 tied a 53 year state record. In MS, he has won 8 ATA trophies at the state shoot through 2015, including 4 handicap trophies. In 1993, he had a long run of 399/400 in preliminary singles at the Grand American. In all, Bob has won ATA trophies in 12 states.

To date, he has shot over 144,000 registered targets in all 3 disciplines combined and also over 40,000 registered skeet targets.

Bob has been a LA State Team member since 1991. In 1997 and 1998, he served as LTA Vice-President. He also served as Southeast Area Representative for the LTA.
